## **Monitoring Committee Report**

The committee priorities for this year fall under the following 3 categories:

- 1. Congregational Survey: This would be very similar to the surveys conducted in the past couple of years. The committee will look to leverage the same set of questions, follow a similar process to collect survey input from the congregation, and analyze the data using similar tools/methodologies.
  - a. Next Steps Rob to develop a timeline and process to launch the congregational survey by October 6. The goal will be to complete the survey data gathering process by end of October/November timeframe.
- 2. Inspection of Executive Limitation: The committee is considering inspecting one or both of the following Executive Limitations
  - a. 2.3 Financial Planning/Budgeting
  - b. 2.4 Financial Conditions & Activities
    - i. Next Steps: Dave to develop a proposal for conducting the inspection of above-mentioned executive limitations.
- 3. Process to gather stories about progress toward the Ends: In an effort to understand the impact of the Church and its Ends on the congregation, we are considering taking a 2-pronged approach to gather stories
  - a. Leverage the Stewardship drive in October/November to pose a few simple questions to a randomly selected cross-section of the congregation and understand the impact the church has had on their lives.
    - i. Next Steps: Toni to coordinate with the Stewardship Committee and develop a proposal for this initiative. The goal would be to complete the data gathering exercise by the end of the Stewardship Drive.
  - b. Hold Deeper 1:1 Conversations with a select set of congregants and get their stories around the church's impact on their lives.
    - Next Steps: Nesan will develop a short proposal that includes questions, a methodology for selecting members of the congregation for the exercise and timeline (potentially a Fall and Spring cycle) to launch this initiative.

Proposed timelines and next steps for all 3 categories of activities will be shared during the October Board meeting.
